

When this spirited third grader came to the Stern Center in January, he proudly identified as an athlete—but didn't yet see himself as a learner. His pediatrician recommended the Stern Center to his family, and though his ADHD diagnosis didn't explain all his struggles, his family thought targeted instruction could help.

A few months later, his father shared that his son had started reading entire classic children's books to his younger sister at bedtime—proudly, expressively, even correcting Dad's storytelling: "You're not reading it right—say it like BANG!"

With each session, his decoding, fluency, and comprehension continue to grow. And most importantly, he's starting to believe what even his little sister can easily see: he's not just trying to read—he is a reader.

When this bright, sensitive four-yearold first came to the Stern Center, he was silent, overwhelmed, and unsure. His family worried—he wasn't talking or playing in age-appropriate ways.

The first sessions were hard. He cried and didn't participate. But by week three, he began to connect with his kind and skillful instructor. With structure, stories, snacks, and visual supports, he started to feel safe.

Now, he's telling weekend stories, making jokes, and sharing emotions. He is stepping into the world with new confidence, greater connection, and a growing voice.

Innovative Design for Literacy Learning

What if everyone working with youth—from afterschool programs to sports to theater—understood how to nurture literacy through everyday activities? Could we build better readers by supporting youth services colleagues at organizations like the Boys and Girls Club? This pilot project demonstrated that literacy programming belongs everywhere, and integrating basic literacy principles can make a powerful everyday difference.

Teaming Up for Impact

Stern Center Structured Literacy Coach Elizabeth Keenan mentored a talented social worker, Celeste Stewart, based at the Boys & Girls Club of Lower Naugatuck Valley in Connecticut. Their virtual planning engaged Club kids in literacy-rich activities over two years of collaboration. Outcomes include both reading breakthroughs for individual youngsters and stronger foundations for future academic success.

Reading Teachers in the Know

This year, over 100 educators discovered their superpowers through the Stern Center Orton-Gillingham Institute, where effective literacy instruction takes flight. Through courses and coaching, teachers gained tools to support beginning and struggling readers. Teacher cohorts in 2025 included Vermont teachers from Addison Northwest, Central Vermont Supervisory Union, and South Burlington; and from locations in Florida, Wisconsin, California, Canada, and Qatar.

What is Orton-Gillingham?

The Orton-Gillingham (OG)
Approach is a structured,
evidence-based method for
teaching literacy to everyone,
including beginner and struggling
readers. Grounded in cognitive
psychology and neuroscience,
the OG Approach emphasizes the
explicit teaching of the structure
of the English language. The
OG Approach equips learners,
including individuals with
dyslexia, to become independent,
lifelong readers and writers.



Robert Jones (1934-2025)






